Out goes a Florida man, in comes a Florida woman. Hours after Matt Gaetz, Donald Trump's pick for attorney general, withdrew from consideration, the president-elect last night announced that he will nominate Pam Bondi to lead the Justice Department.

Bondi, a former attorney general of Florida, is widely viewed as a more serious and confirmable pick, and although that is partly a statement of what a ridiculous choice Gaetz was, it also shows how far expectations—and standards—have been lowered since the start of the first Trump administration. In 2017, Bondi was passed over for an administration role for fear that she was too scandal-tainted. This time around, she's the safe, acceptable fallback choice.

Federal officials declined to provide more information to Fox News Digital about a "humanitarian flight" that Laken Riley's convicted killer, Jose Ibarra, was granted from New York City to Atlanta in September 2023.


Marciano came on to win after being floored in the first round, the first knockdown of his 43-fight career.

Going into the thirteenth round, Walcott was ahead on all three official scorecards. 38-year-old champion backed up to the ropes and began to launch a right hand, but Marciano beat him to it and put him down for the count with one of the most devastating right-hands in boxing history.



Jim Thorpe (1888-1953) is one of the greatest athletes in American sports history, recognized as one of the most talented athletes of the 20th century. Thorpe, a Native American belonging to the Sauk and Fox tribes, was born in Oklahoma in 1888. He was known for his versatility in various sports, including horse racing, football, soccer, and track and field.

At the 1912 Summer Olympics in Stockholm, Sweden, Thorpe won two gold medals, one in the pentathlon and one in the decathlon. This made him the first and only athlete in history to win gold medals in both events in the same Olympics.

In addition to his Olympic achievements, Thorpe was a renowned football player, competing for teams such as the Carlisle Indian Industrial School and professional teams like the Canton Bulldogs. He also played in Major League Baseball for a period.

In 1982, a statue of Jim Thorpe was erected in his honor in his birthplace of Prague, Oklahoma. This statue, crafted by artist John Gooden, stands as a tribute to Thorpe's remarkable athletic achievements and enduring legacy. It serves as a reminder of his contributions to sports history and his status as a revered figure in Native American and American sports culture. The statue portrays Thorpe in an iconic pose, capturing his strength, determination, and athleticism. It stands as a symbol of inspiration for future generations and a testament to Thorpe's enduring impact on the world of sports.

Jim Thorpe is recognized as an icon of resilience, strength, and talent among Native American athletes and American sports culture. He has had a profound influence on subsequent generations of athletes and Native Americans, and his name is still remembered and honored in both the sports community and American society.

Native Farm Bill Coalition disputes \$380M estimate for food sovereignty program

The Native Farm Bill Coalition (NFBC) is challenging the U.S. Department of Agriculture over what it calls a flawed cost estimate for making a popular food sovereignty pilot program permanent.

In an Aug. 9 <u>letter</u> to USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack, the coalition expressed "complete shock" about the Congressional Budget Office's (CBO) \$380 million cost estimate over eight years for the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) program. The coalition, which represents more than 170 tribes and tribal organizations, claimed that the figure starkly contrasts estimates provided in the 2018 Farm Bill, raising concerns that the discrepancy could undermine the program's future.


