ciology from the California Indians Nations College/College of The Desert. She has been accepted to California State University, San Bernardino and plans to become a counselor.

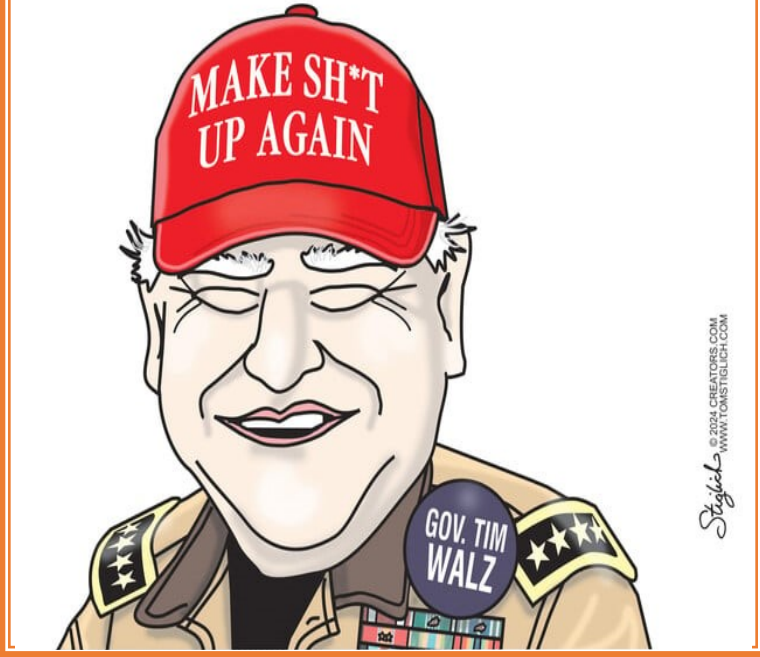

'F**k that.' Fetterman slams Meta over ruling that anti-Semitic slogan isn't hate speech · American Wire News

Sen. John Fetterman (D-PA) is as feisty as ever, especially when it comes to his stance on defending Israel.

The junior senator was not too happy with Meta, the company that owns Facebook after its board ruled that the infamous cry calling for the removal of Jews does not violate hate speech policy.

"In reviewing three cases involving different pieces of Facebook content containing the phrase 'From the River to the Sea,' the Board finds they did not break Meta's rules on Hate Speech, Violence and Incitement or Dangerous Organizations and Individuals. Specifically, the three pieces of content contain contextual signs of solidarity with Palestinians - but no language calling for violence or exclusion. They also do

not glorify or even refer to Hamas, an organization designated as dangerous by Meta," the company said in a statement.

Fetterman did not mince words in reacting on X, "F**k that. It's blatant anti-semitic hate speech calling for the elimination of Israel from the map."

Anti-Defamation League CEO Jonathan Greenblatt responded to the ruling by blasting Meta's Oversight Board for its "pattern of supreme indifference to online hate and harassment."

"ADL believes that the phrase 'from the river to the sea' is hate speech," Greenblatt said in a statement shared on social media

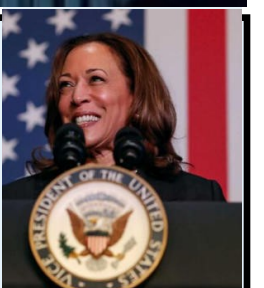

Harris to go all-in on abortion as real issues no longer matter Name change: Reproductive Rights



Vice President Kamala Harris has reportedly begun to *with her body,*" according to Politico. 'make abortion a central theme of her presidential campaign. Democrats reportedly always intended to make abortion a central theme going into the 2024 race but were distracted for a few weeks by concerns over President Joe Biden's out of the race, abortion as their uniting theme.

Harris told campaign staff in Wilmington, Delaware, that she would prevent Republicans from enacting a national ban because 'the government should not be telling a woman

FOR NATIVE AMERICAN ECONOMIC FREEDOM, UNRAVEL THE 'WHITE TAPE'

New television and movie releases offer a chance to reflect on how and why Native Americans went from relative prosperity to poverty, particularly over the last two centuries.

Ken Burns’s “The American Buffalo,” a two-part series on PBS, ostensibly is about the near extinction of buffalo at the end of hunters’ rifles. The greater tragedy, however, is the story of how the federal government broke treaties and used the buffalo carnage to force American Indians into near starvation and submission.

Another tragic story is told in “Killers of the Flower Moon,” starring Leonardo DiCaprio. The three-hour epic depicts how murder and deception enabled white men to steal land and oil rights from the Osage Tribe in Oklahoma.

But the cause of Native American poverty goes far beyond these sad stories; it is embedded in Federal Indian Law by wrapping tribes in “white tape,” as the late Coughatta Tribal Chairman Ernest Sickey called their bureaucratic quagmire. In 1831, the U.S. Supreme Court declared Native Americans to be “wards” of the federal government, leading to aggressive suppression of cultural and religious practices that had important economic implications and were part of the heritage we should celebrate.

Unwrapping the white tape requires much more than bringing back the buffalo and righting the wrongs to the Osage. It requires removing the

court’s antiquated assertion and undoing any notion that only the government can deem its so-called wards as “competent and capable,” words embedded in a law passed in 1906 that remain to this day.

Thanks to policies like these, tribal land and resources are held in trust by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and cannot be used without government permission. In one case, tribes in North Dakota missed out on millions of dollars from the fracking boom because trust lands required 49 regulatory steps before they could be leased, compared to four steps off reservations. Not surprisingly, 1 in 4 reservation Indians live in poverty and many survive on federal grants.

As our new survey of over 80 reservations confirms, the spirit of entrepreneurship survives on reservations but must be unwrapped from white tape.

Scoring these reservations on factors such as private land ownership, independent judiciaries, streamlined regulations and separation of powers, we found that residents who are afforded greater economic autonomy had substantially higher median household incomes. On average, those living with 10 percent more of these forms of autonomy earn over \$2,500 more.

Reservations with relatively more say over their money and resources, such as Hoopa Valley in California and Mille Lacs in Minnesota, are among the most prosperous in terms of median household income.

The opposite is true in reservations with less control over their own resources, which tend to be much poorer, such as the Ute Mountain

Ute and Uintah and the Ouray in Utah. Across all reservations we surveyed, this dynamic was clear enough that it cannot be deemed a coincidence.

Policies allowing more individual indigenous control over these individuals’ own property — a worthwhile end unto itself — will incentivize productivity-enhancing investments and prosperity. Repealing antiquated laws that deny this, notably the 1934 Indian Reorganization Act, would be a start. When an impartial judiciary, armed with the right legal framework, protects property rights and supports the rule of law vital for commerce, local economic growth will follow. Reducing bureaucratic white tape will encourage on-reservation entrepreneurship by lowering costs for Native American businesses, generating more income.

Currently, far-off federal agencies administer health care, education, infrastructure and social services. With both their own resources and those directed to them, tribal self-governance holds the real promise of prosperity. Tribal authorities, accountable to their people, have the local knowledge of how and where to invest resources and generate future growth.

Further, supporting tribes in setting up their own impartial judicial systems will improve trust in local institutions, which is vital to incentivizing the investments needed to rise from poverty. Additionally, tribal judicial systems would be strengthened by more adequately funding native courts and law enforcement. The resulting impartial protection of property rights and

corresponding support for the rule of law is as vital for commerce in the modern world as it was when our government initially failed in its promises to Native Americans.

The new documentary and movie are powerful reminders of how our government has treated American Indians. The time has come to right these wrongs by instead treating the continent’s first human inhabitants as competent, capable, sovereign people with the right to own their land and manage their lives.

The recent supreme court ruling regarding government agencies not having the Constitutional authority to establish “Regulations and or Policies,” is a major game changer for the Tribes. Whether they take advantage of it yet to be seen.

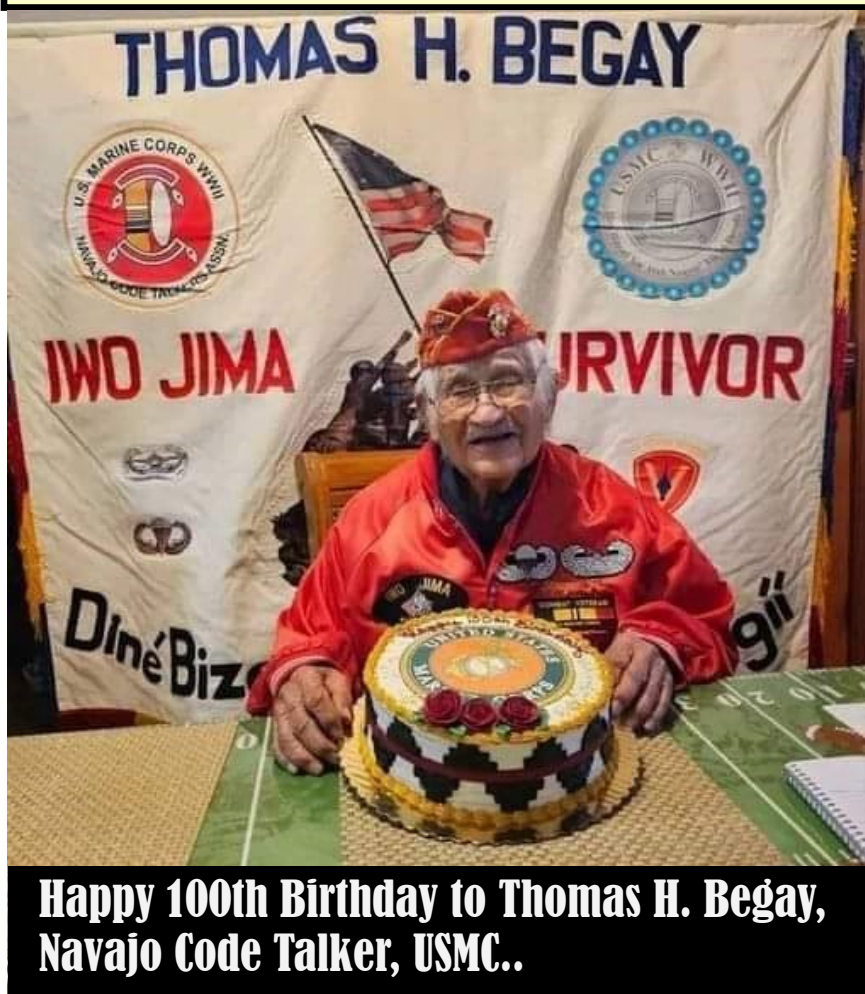
As they stated, “Repealing antiquated laws that deny or hamper economic growth, notably the 1934 Indian Reorganization Act, would be a good start.”

For clarification Tribal Lands are held in trust on behalf of the Tribes by the United States Government.

The U. S. Department of Interior is charged with the oversight of the Tribal Affairs and the Bureau of Indian Affairs, an agency within the DOI provides the day-to-day business with and for the Tribes.

No Historical Ties: Scotts Valley's Vallejo Claim Lacks Evidence

The Department of the Interior has been working in secret to fast-track a massive urban casino in the Bay Area city of Vallejo, undermining public notice, tribal consultation, and environmental review requirements along the way.

The Department of the Interior is considering a proposal by the Scotts Valley Band of Pomo Indians - from Clear Lake, nearly 100 miles away - to exploit a loophole in the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (IGRA), but the real beneficiaries would be rich Las Vegas investors. Local Patwin tribes, who have worked for generations to protect cultural and ecological resources in and around Vallejo, have been cut out of the process and would be irreparably harmed.

Forgotten keepers of the Rio Grande Delta

Juan Benito Mancias draws his identity from the landscape at the Rio Grande's end not because he owns it, but because it owns his people, literally. His ancestors lie buried in it, going back millennia.

He knows about the old river with ancient forest and enormous, teeming marshlands of which only glimpses remain. He knows how much was lost and how quickly it happened.

Sadly for Mancias, U.S. law provides him no rights to protect his forebearers' graves, even as they're ripped from the ground by machines. The official story says the flourishing cultures of this once-mighty river delta died out, leaving no one to speak for their prime Gulf Coast real estate on the southern tip of Texas.

He also knows that people don't believe him. He heard the same lines all his life: that the original inhabitants of Texas are gone, that his grandparents made up their stories, that he was just a Mexican from Lubbock.

The law gives no special rights to groups like the Carrizo/Comecrudo, whose family stories tell how they survived centuries of genocide and escaped final resettlement campaigns by blending in, scattering and avoiding attention.

It's a convenient myth for the developers who see cheap land and labor near the Mexican border as their chance to build Texas' next great industrial complex, here at the state's last available deepwater port. But it's not true.

Only federally recognized tribes can claim legal rights to their cultural or historic sites, and the process of winning recognition requires groups to produce extensive documentation proving who they are and how they survived to the very same entity that once tried to exterminate them.

Mancias, now a 70-year-old, long-haired great-grandfather, knows secret stories that could never be written, about the last free villages on the Rio Grande's banks, about the massacres, about his people's disguises and about their flight, at last, in the 1940s to the Panhandle of Texas, where he grew up picking cotton.

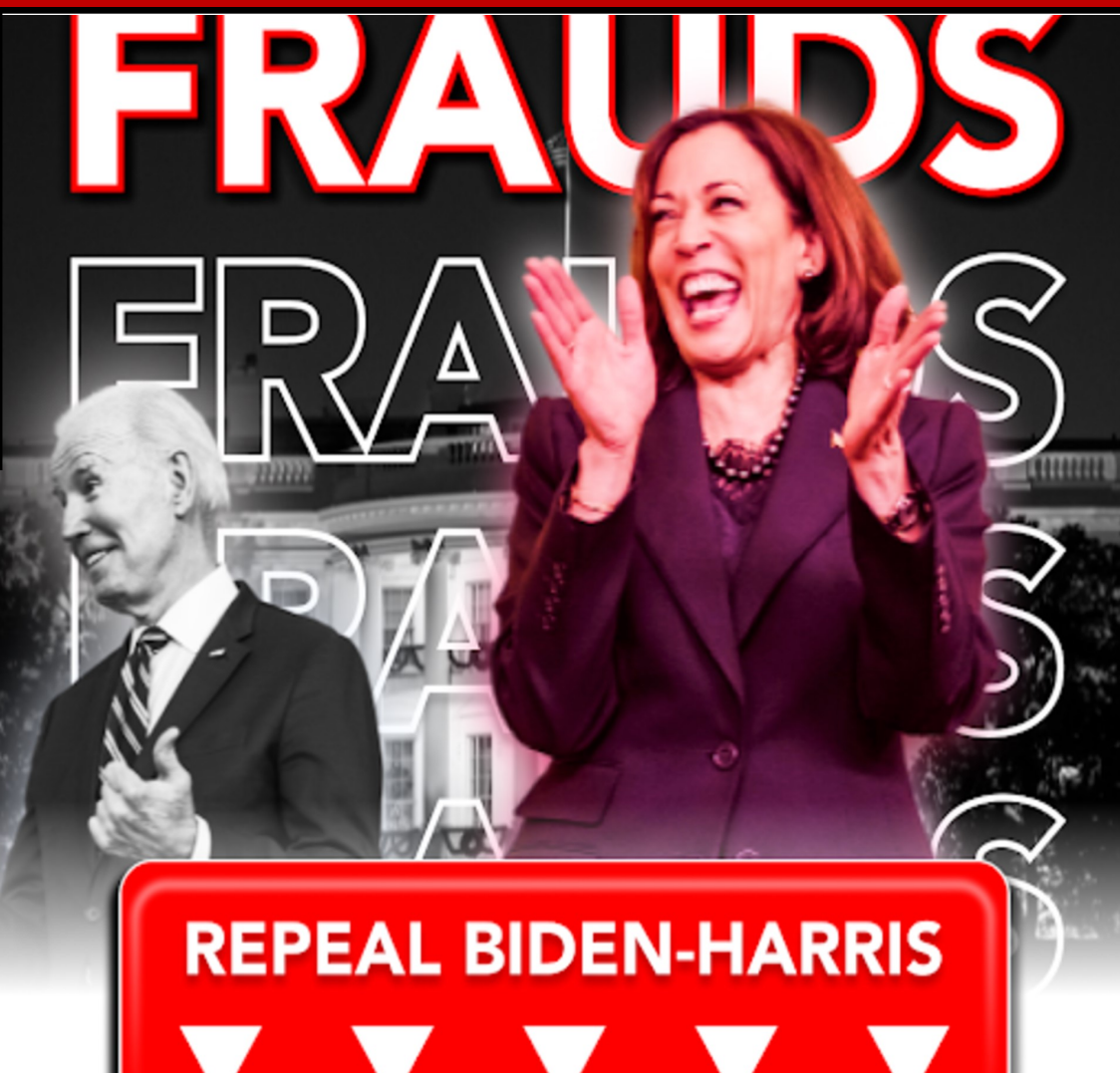

Ahead of the Monday debut of a discussion with Minnesota National Guard veterans, the commentator teased impressions of

Walz that raised the question, "What are you gonna do at the national level?" As Kelly posited, "Why did you come forward?" the veterans expressed the "morally indefensible" action taken by the politician who had retired after 24 years with the Guard just as his battalion was being ordered to deploy to Iraq so that he could run for Congress. "He's a military impersonator," insisted one of them who argued, "It was just unbelievable that a [command sergeant major] abandoned his troops."

The latest pile-on about Walz's representation of his record came after 50 veterans serving in Congress rebuked the governor for having "lied your way through a political career launched on the foundation of a title you did not earn and combat deployments you did not take part in," demanding a response. At the same time, the top of the ticket was facing scorn for her own failed accountability three years after 13 service members were killed at the Abbey Gate in Afghanistan leading her to attempt to leverage

a ceremony attended by former President Donald Trump into what the Gold Star families called a "heinous, vile and disgusting" attack. While lauding followed for the veterans and Kelly for giving them a platform to speak, one of the veterans made it clear, "Fear is a reaction. Bravery is a decision. And Walz has made wrong decisions. He's not brave. I call him a coward, 'cause he is." [Read More @ American Wire](#)

Democratic Gov. Wes Moore of Maryland falsely claimed on an application to have been awarded a Bronze Star Medal for his Army service in Afghanistan in 2006, according to The New York Times. Moore claimed to have received the honor on a White House fellowship application in 2006, and has failed to correct television hosts who have wrongly introduced him as a recipient of the award in the past, the NY Times reported.

Moore, who has also defended Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz amid his accusations of stolen valor, called the discrepancy an "honest mistake" and expressed regret for not correcting his application, according to a statement from Thursday. "I was encouraged to fill out an application for the White House Fellowship by my deputy brigade commander," Moore said in a statement. "In fact, he helped me edit it before I sent it in. At the time, he had recommended me for the

Bronze Star. He told me to include the Bronze Star award on my application after confirming with two other senior-level officers that they had also signed off on the commendation." "Still, I sincerely wish I had gone back to correct the note on my application," Moore continued. "It was an honest mistake, and I regret not making that correction."

“Why records matter” Why are records important?

As the State Council on Archivists reminds us:

Records protect life.

Medical records allow doctors to treat patients safely and effectively

Maps and floorplans allow rescue workers to locate victims of disasters

Infrastructure records showing locations of utility lines keep rescue workers safe

Construction records help engineers assess damages to bridges, tunnels, levees, etc.

Records protect property.

Plats, deed, and mortgage records establish ownership of real property

Insurance records help owners recover losses

Probate records and wills prove inheritance

Bank records verify financial assets

Divorce records include property distribution

Records protect rights.

School records document educational attainment

Adoption records establish parental rights

Military service and employment records provide access to pensions and other benefits

Guardianship records protect those who cannot speak for themselves

Records are essential to restoring order and resuming operations following a disaster.

Businesses need proof of assets, liabilities, contracts, and other legal obligations

Governments need documentation of decisions, regulations, precedents, and lines of succession and authority

Individuals need proof of identity, medical histories, and documentation of asset

Communities need historical records to retain a sense of continuity with the past on which to build a future

Traditionally, records were oral, stored in the brain, retrieved by memory, shared by word of mouth.

Borders and territories were delineated with physical objects. Pictographs evolved giving a new dimension to recordkeeping.

As written language grew, paper making and scribes issued in a new industry and vocation. Languages gave form to art expressions such as calligraphy and XXXXXX.

With expanding literacy and debut of the printing press, records took on new formats and began the mountains of paper that have delighted and plagued homes and offices for several centuries.

Typewriters and carbon paper standardized format, ease of reading, and the concept of multiple copies which were expanded with the magic of “xerox” copy, mimeograph and fax machines providing systematic distribution. Microfilming became the rage of reducing paper piles.

Enter the electronic age: Gazillions of little electronic messengers pulsate through the universe at every moment of the day, transmitting a plethora of information both written and in picture form to thousands of viewers, many of whom have an arm extension in the form of an I-phone which not only records almost ever detail of their life but also provides instant access to a spirit that provides the answer to anything one wants to know.

Like any new epoch or “invention”, there is both good and bad to be experienced.

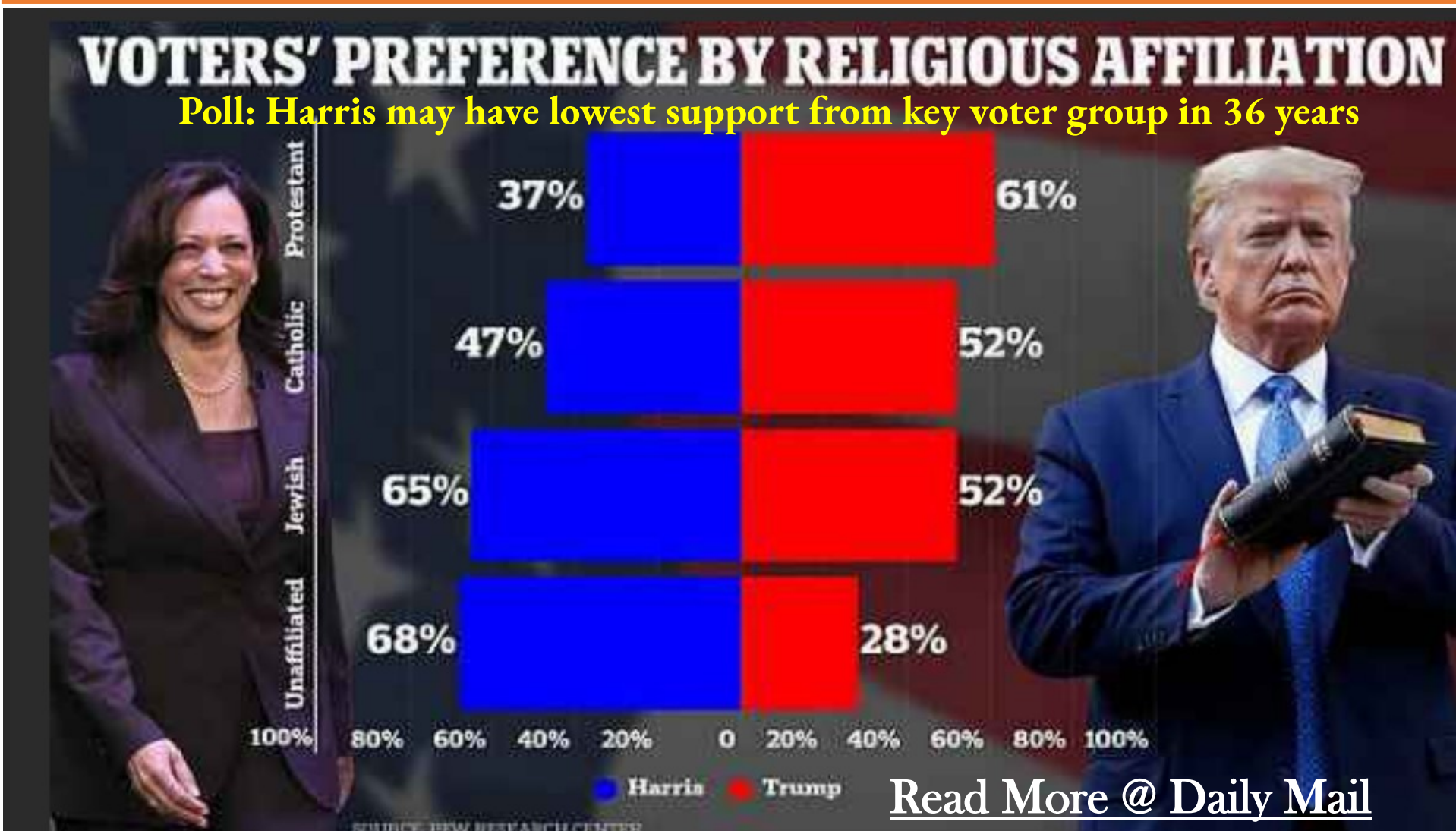
Indian Country is repeat with examples of lost life, community holdings, personal property, to say nothing of rights because of not having “the paper” to document a winning side of an issue. Oral histories have become corrupt when no one documents statements. Non-savant brains cannot simply remember everything that passes through them. Unless an entity (self, business head, newspaper, library, governmental jurisdiction) sets up a system of assessment, accession, and accessibility, “information” is now everywhere and no where.

In past issues (maybe too far back!) this column has discussed the need for tribes to pass an ordinance declaring tribal records as property and subject to applicable codes and ordinances that make destruction or alteration of such punishable.

Biden Spokesman Mistakenly Lets Reporter Know What He Really Thinks About Vets Angry At Afghanistan Debacle [Read More @ Tampa Free Press](#)

White House spokesman **John Kirby** told staffers via email on Wednesday (Sept. 11, 2024) that there was “no use” in responding to veterans’ concerns about the Biden administration’s Afghanistan withdrawal – but he mistakenly also sent the message to Fox News.

The White House has faced years of criticism for the 2021 withdrawal, which was widely seen as a disastrous operation and a failure of leadership in Washington. Amid the third anniversary of the withdrawal, Kirby wrote in an email to staffers on Wednesday that it was a waste of time to chime in on veterans’ opinions about the with-

drawal and accidentally included Fox News on the chain after the outlet had sent an initial media inquiry.

“Obviously no use in responding. A ‘handful’ of vets indeed and all of one stripe,” Kirby wrote in a reply-all email chain with White House staffers and Fox News.

When pressed by Fox News why he sent the email, Kirby told the outlet he “didn’t realize you were on the chain.” The email thread was started when Fox reached out to the White House about criticism for the 2021 withdrawal, which included four quotes from veterans criti-

cizing the operation. Kirby’s reply came while he was traveling with President Joe Biden during a visit to New York on the anniversary of the Sept. 11, 2001 attacks.

The Afghanistan withdrawal was initially planned by the former Trump administration in 2020, but executed by the Biden administration in a disordered and abrupt fashion. A lack of planning and leadership – and an incorrect prediction that the Taliban wouldn’t seize the country so quickly – created a chaotic situation for U.S. military forces on the ground and led to the deaths of 13 servicemembers.

Four and a half years after the pandemic sent workers home, the office property bill is finally coming due.

The market for office buildings – already reeling from higher vacancy rates amid the rise in remote-work policies – has been crushed by high borrowing costs, and while the Federal Reserve is at last preparing to cut interest rates, it may be too little, too late. Investors, banks and property owners are now beginning to accept that some commercial buildings will never recover their pre-pandemic value, and that’s leading to a steady drumbeat of distressed sales.

The market’s troubles have caught the attention of Congress – with one New York lawmaker calling it a “ticking time bomb” for banks as

nearly \$1 trillion in commercial real estate loans are coming due this year. Faced with vacant office buildings and a shortage of millions of homes to meet demand, a bipartisan group of lawmakers is trying to make it easier for developers to convert underused properties into housing.

“This would absolutely help lenders recoup some of their investment while allowing them to align with the current needs of the market,” said Rep. **Mike Carey (R-Ohio)** who introduced a bill this summer establishing a temporary 20 percent tax credit for qualified property conversion expenditures.

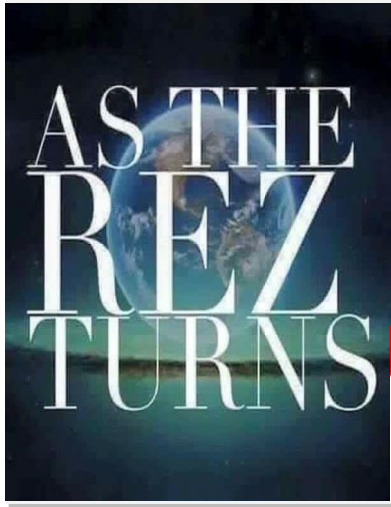
“The pandemic caused a seismic shift in work patterns,” said Carey, who offered the bill with



Rep. **Jimmy Gomez (D-Calif.)**. “We see these vacant office buildings as a well of untapped potential.”

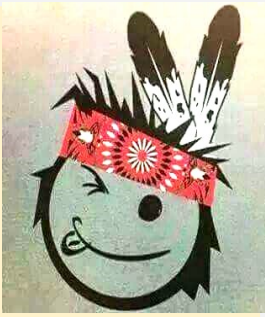
