Newsom signs \$2.8B bailout for healthcare program overrun by illegal immigrants

Liberal Gov. Gavin Newsom signed a \$2.8 billion bailout Monday to close the state's bloated deficit in California's Medicaid program, which surpassed projections due to the program's expansion last year to include illegal immigrants.

*"Meanwhile, healthcare access is plummeting. Wait times are growing. Democrats have made their choice: legal residents come second,"* California Republican state Senate Minority Leader

Brian Jones wrote on X. *"We must stop new enrollments of illegal immigrants and rein in this unsustainable program before it collapses entirely."*

According to state data, roughly 1.6 million illegal immigrants are currently enrolled in Medi-Cal, part of the program's total 15 million enrollees. The state had initially projected the expansion would cost just under \$6 billion for fiscal

year 2024–2025. But just one year in, the costs have surged far past that estimate.

Newsom's latest budget proposal now puts the cost of covering illegal immigrants at \$8.4 billion for 2024–2025, and \$7.4 billion the following year. .

## Jonathan Turley says he’s ‘confused’ why Amy Coney Barrett joined liberal justices in SCOTUS’ deportation ruling

George Washington University law professor Jonathan Turley expressed confusion Tuesday (April 8, 2025) about why Supreme Court Associate Justice Amy Coney Barrett dissented from a ruling allowing President Donald Trump to use a 1798 law to deport gang members.

The Supreme Court **ruled** late Monday (April 7, 2025) that the Trump administration could use the **Alien Enemies Act** to deport members of the Venezuelan prison gang Tren de Aragua (TdA) in a 5-4 decision. Turley questioned why Barrett joined Associate Justices Sonia Sotomayor, Elena Kagan and Ketanji Brown-Jackson in their dissent to the majority’s opinion.

*“The dissent is a little bit odd here, these four justices, particularly Justice Barrett. [I] wrote on my blog this morning, I still don’t quite know why Barrett joined the dissent,”* Turley said. *“She joined a small part of it. Part of that was saying they get due process rights, but the majority said that. So I’m still rather confused as why Justice Barrett dissented.”*

Chief Justice John Roberts also **paused** a Friday (April 4, 2025) **order** by United States District Judge Paula Xinis requiring the Trump administration to return Abrego Garcia, an adjudicated member of the El Salvadoran prison gang MS-13, to the United States.

Native American students make up 11 percent of public school enrollment in New Mexico. Yet there are not enough resources for them to learn their Native languages. A bill passed in the recent legislative session will create new schools under a state-tribal compact to address those gaps.

New Mexico has 23 sovereign tribes and among those tribes eight languages are spoken, but only seven are taught in school districts.

Senate Bill 13 will create a five-year pilot program with five schools prioritizing distinct Native languages of Tiwa, Tewa, Towa, Keres, Apache, Zuni, and Diné.

Bill co-sponsor Sen. Benny Shendo Jr. (D-Jemez Pueblo) said that many Native parents and grandparents have been conditioned to believe the only way to succeed was to speak English.

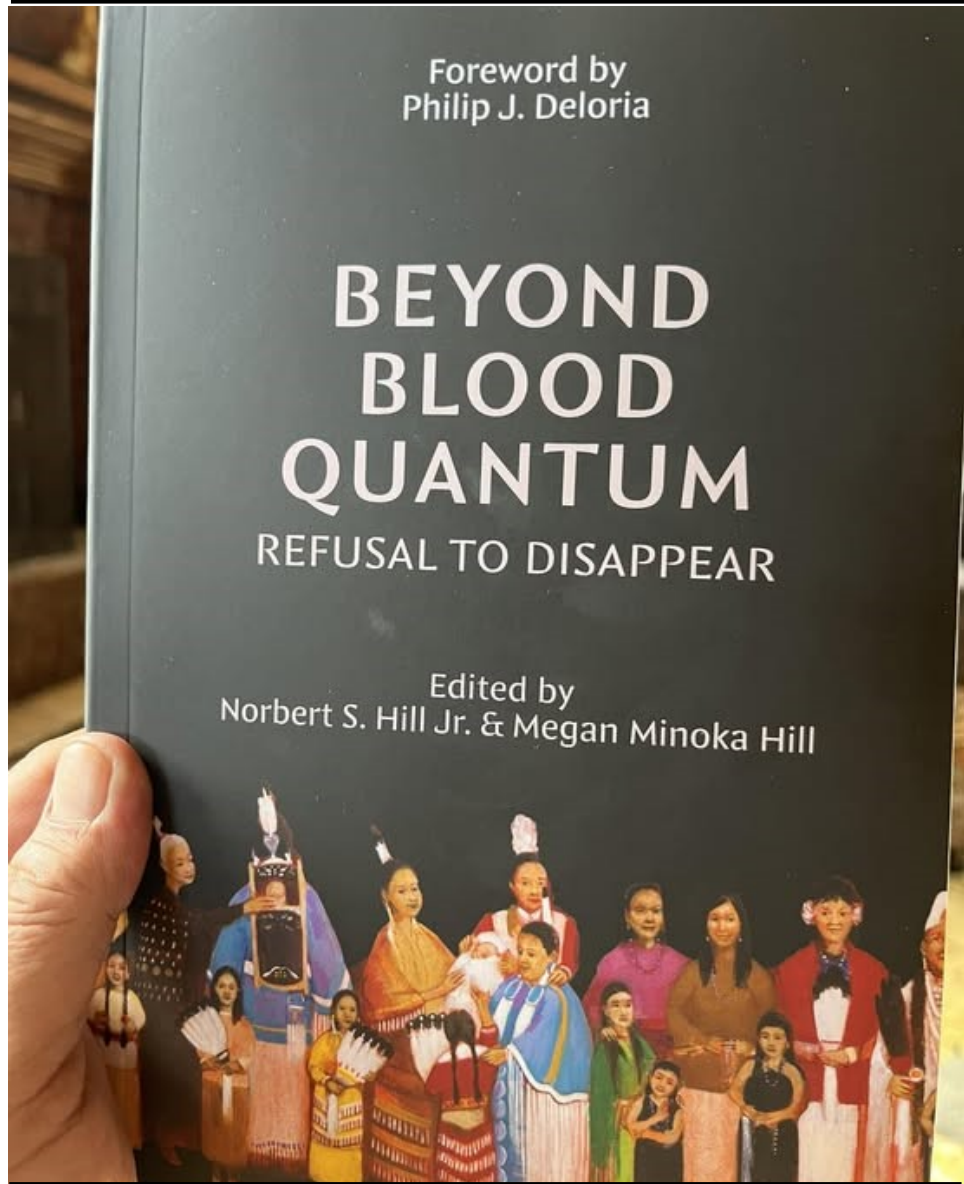
*“But that’s not true,” he said. “I was born and raised speaking my language. It wasn’t much later that I began to learn English. So how can that be when those of us that were fluent Native speakers are able to be successful in college and all the stuff that we’re doing today?”*

He said a lot of Native students are struggling because they don’t feel that they belong.

Native American students have historically re-

ported lower achievement and graduation rates than their peers. The New Mexico Indian Education Act stresses the importance of maintaining Native languages and culture. But programs providing these opportunities are currently limited within public schools. 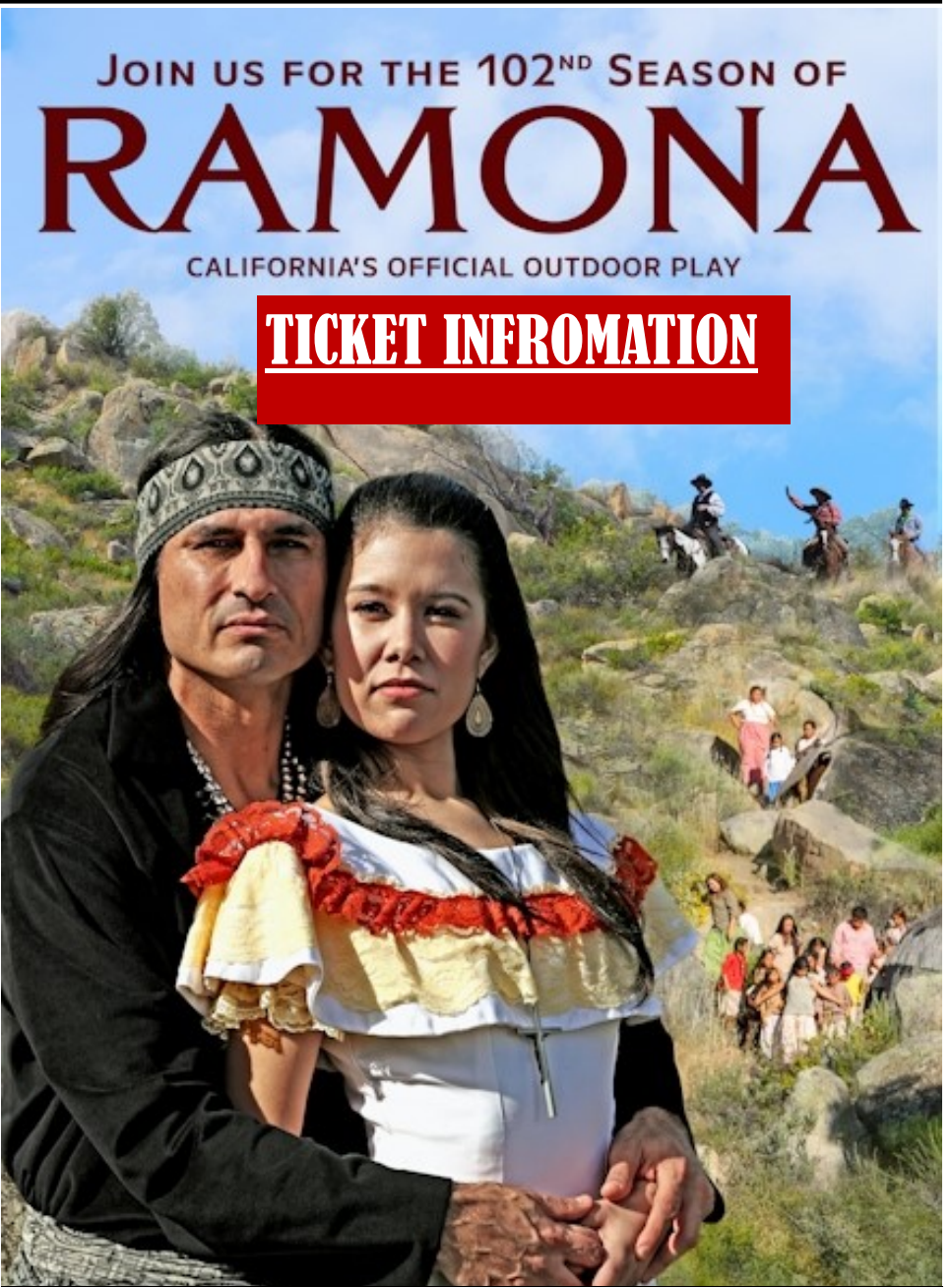

# Fairbanks-based Tribes Extension Program is at forefront in sharing traditional knowledge

Food security is not an exclusively Alaska issue, but the land and location can sometimes necessitate different approaches. Molly Cerridwen, a Yup'ik traditional healer and herbalist who works with the University of Alaska Fairbanks Tribes Extension Program, is a part of a group of elders and traditional knowledge holders who serve in a role unique to the program.

*“No other state has decided to do this; Alaska is at the forefront,”* said Cerridwen. With family ties to Qaluyaaq, or Nelson Island, in Southwest Alaska, Cerridwen, who grew up in the Interior community of Nenana, weaves traditional health-based practices with complementary and alternative medicine modalities to work with and support tribes in their pursuit of food security, resiliency and economic diversity.

Historically, the Cooperative Extension Service was designed around Lower 48 programs where an agent was assigned to help farmers and ranchers with education and grants.

*“The interesting thing with Alaska, we have 229 tribes and a lot of what Extension does is face-to-face education through workshops,”* said Rader, who has led the program for nearly 20 years. The TEP program

currently hosts a blog, educates through YouTube, and facilitates workshops online through webinars and in-person with educators like Cerridwen.

*“One of my frameworks in my traditional healing practice is that each family held on to bits of traditional knowledge. And my family held on to plant medicine,”* said Cerridwen. *“Every family has a medicine, that medicine might be art in the form of beadwork, art in the form of ivory carving. It might be mask-making. It could be music. It could be dance. It could be language. This is all medicine that, when we come together as a collective, we can share with each other the medicine our families were able to hold on to through colonization and learn from each other. That is healing. That is creating community and also sharing this experience that many, if not all families experienced.”*

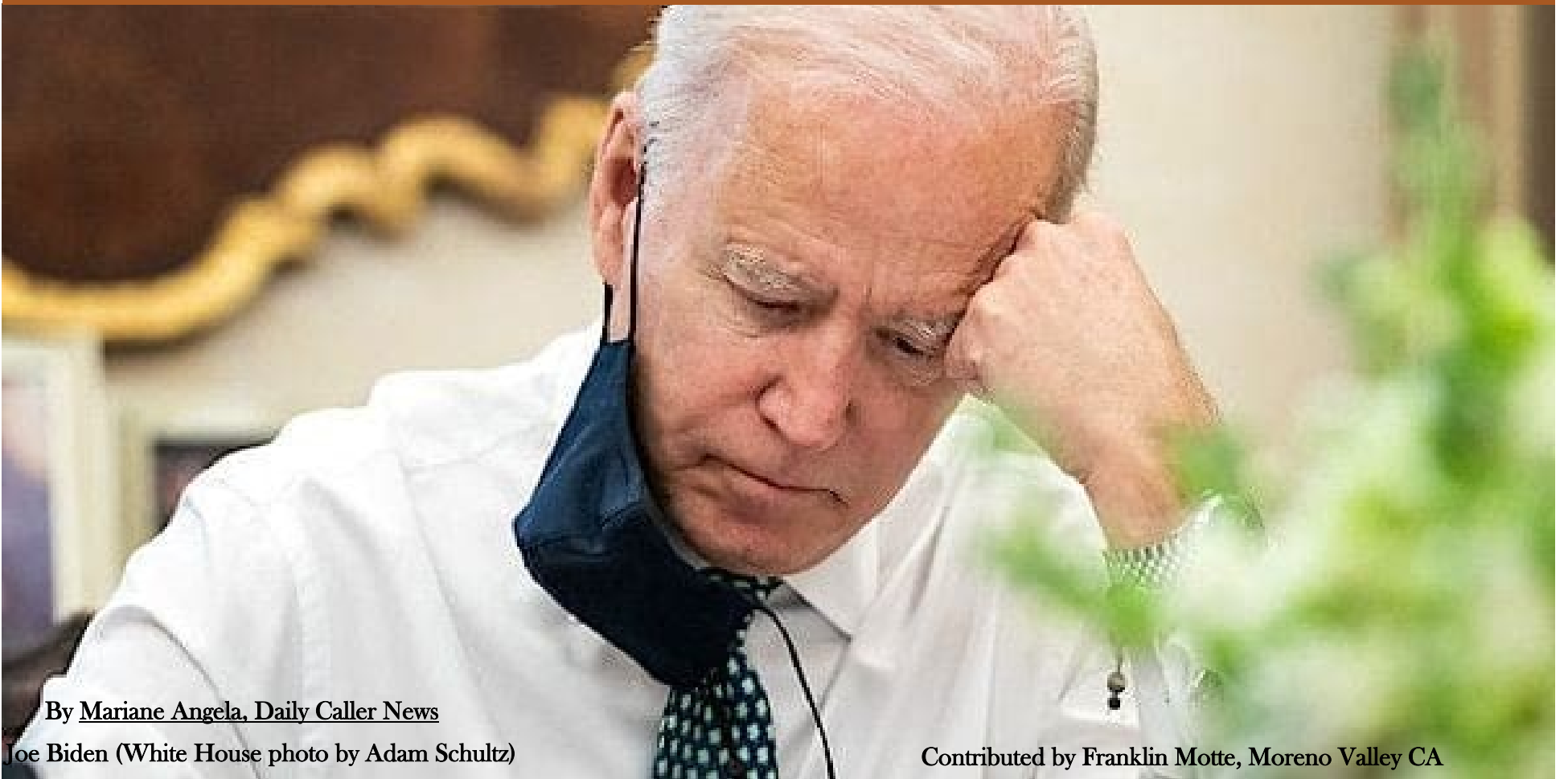

## Gingrich: 'Who made the decisions as though they were president?'

Former House Speaker Newt Gingrich appeared on Fox News Thursday and called for the creation of either a joint House-Senate committee or a special commission to investigate whether Joe Biden was mentally incapacitated during his term as president and also whether White House staff concealed it.

In Chris Whipple's new book, former top aide Ron Klain revealed that during debate preparations Biden often struggled and would fall asleep. During an appearance on "Jesse Watters Primetime," Gingrich said that the investigation should not only uncover the truth about Biden's mental fitness but also determine the

constitutional implications when people who aren't president make decisions on the president's behalf.

*"I think both the House and the Senate should empanel special committees to just focus on this issue. Who was the president? Who lied about the president? Who made the decisions as though they were president? And what is the constitutional implication of having people who are not the president making these kinds of decisions? I think this is a very serious, profound historic moment, not a political moment. It ought to be a truly bipartisan committee, truly bipartisan effort,"* Gingrich said.

*"Either there has to be a joint House and Senate committee, or there has to be a special commission. I have to say, in all the years I've studied, both as a history teacher and as an elected official, the idea that these people knew — it's pretty clear now that a lot of them knew that he was gone,"* Gingrich told Watters.

*"Because all of us ought to have an interest as Americans in knowing what happened and how could we have been lied to for at least a minimum of two or two and a half years."*

## OPEC+ is boosting output in April. Here's what that could mean for oil prices.



Tighter U.S. sanctions on Iran and Russia, threats of sanctions on buyers of Venezuelan oil and concerns over a possible tariff-related recession have all provided support to oil, setting up prices to end the month very close to where they started.

And a lot has happened in the few weeks since OPEC+ confirmed they would start to lift production with the U.S., reportedly indicating that it plans to refill its oil reserve to full capacity, shifting tariff-policy plans from the Trump administration and flare-ups in the Middle East.

Given all of that, Tompkins said Capital Economics expects any near-term rise in oil prices from U.S. pressure on Venezuela and Iran to "dissipate," and is sticking with its forecast for **Brent crude** to end 2025 at \$70 a barrel.

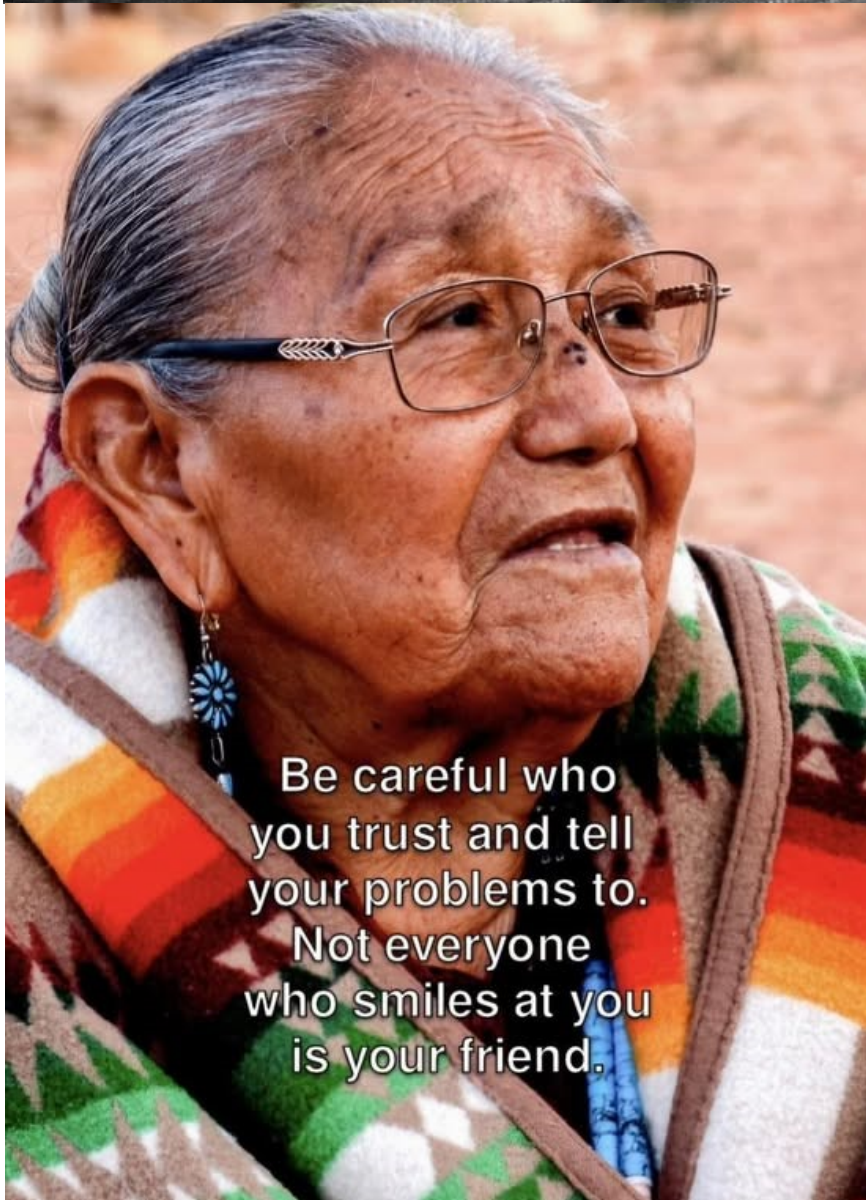

# San Diego’s: Ted Williams Triple Crown Snubs

Imagine dominating every offensive category in baseball—batting average, home runs, RBIs—and still walking away empty-handed from the MVP voting. It sounds impossible, unfair even... but that's exactly what happened to Ted Williams. Not once, but **\*\*twice\*\***. And in 1947, the second time it happened, it became one of the most baffling MVP snubs in MLB history.

In 1947, Ted Williams, famously nicknamed "The Splendid Splinter," was an unstoppable force at the plate. He batted a jaw-dropping **\*\*343\*\***, smashed **\*\*32 home runs\*\***, and racked up **\*\*114 RBIs\*\***, securing the **\*\*American League Triple Crown\*\***. That's a feat so rare, so dominant, that it has only been achieved a handful of times in the entire history of baseball. By all statistical measures, Williams was **\*\*untouchable\*\*** that season. So naturally, you'd expect him to be a unanimous MVP choice, right?

**Wrong.**  
The 1947 MVP award went to none other than Joe DiMaggio of the New York Yankees. DiMaggio, a legend in his own right, had a solid season—he hit **\*\*315\*\***, belted **\*\*20 home runs\*\***, and had **\*\*97 RBIs\*\***. Good numbers, no doubt. But **\*not Triple Crown good\***. Not even close.

Here's where the story gets murky—and madden-ing. Ted Williams had a complicated relationship with the press. He wasn't one to play nice with journalists, often refusing interviews, avoiding small talk, and showing outright disdain for how he was portrayed in the media. The press didn't like that. And back then, the MVP award was voted on by baseball writers. You can do the math.

One sportswriter even left Williams **\*\*off the MVP ballot entirely\*\***, which played a pivotal role in tipping the vote toward DiMaggio. It wasn't about stats—it was about sentiment. Williams didn't smile for the cameras, didn't butter up reporters, and didn't care to charm the public. But he did what mattered most—he performed. And somehow, that wasn't enough.

This wasn't the first time the press penalized him either. Back in 1942, Williams also won the Triple Crown and **\*still\*** didn't win the MVP. On both occasions, he was statistically superior but socially... out of favor.

Baseball fans and historians have long looked back at 1947 as one of the clearest examples of bias in MVP voting. It raises the question: **\*Should personality and public image influence who gets the highest honor in the game?\*** Or should it be purely about performance between



the white chalk lines?  
Ted Williams' story reminds us that greatness isn't always rewarded when it clashes with public perception. The numbers spoke for themselves. **\*\*Res ipsa loquitur\*\***—"the thing speaks for itself." But in 1947, even that wasn't enough.



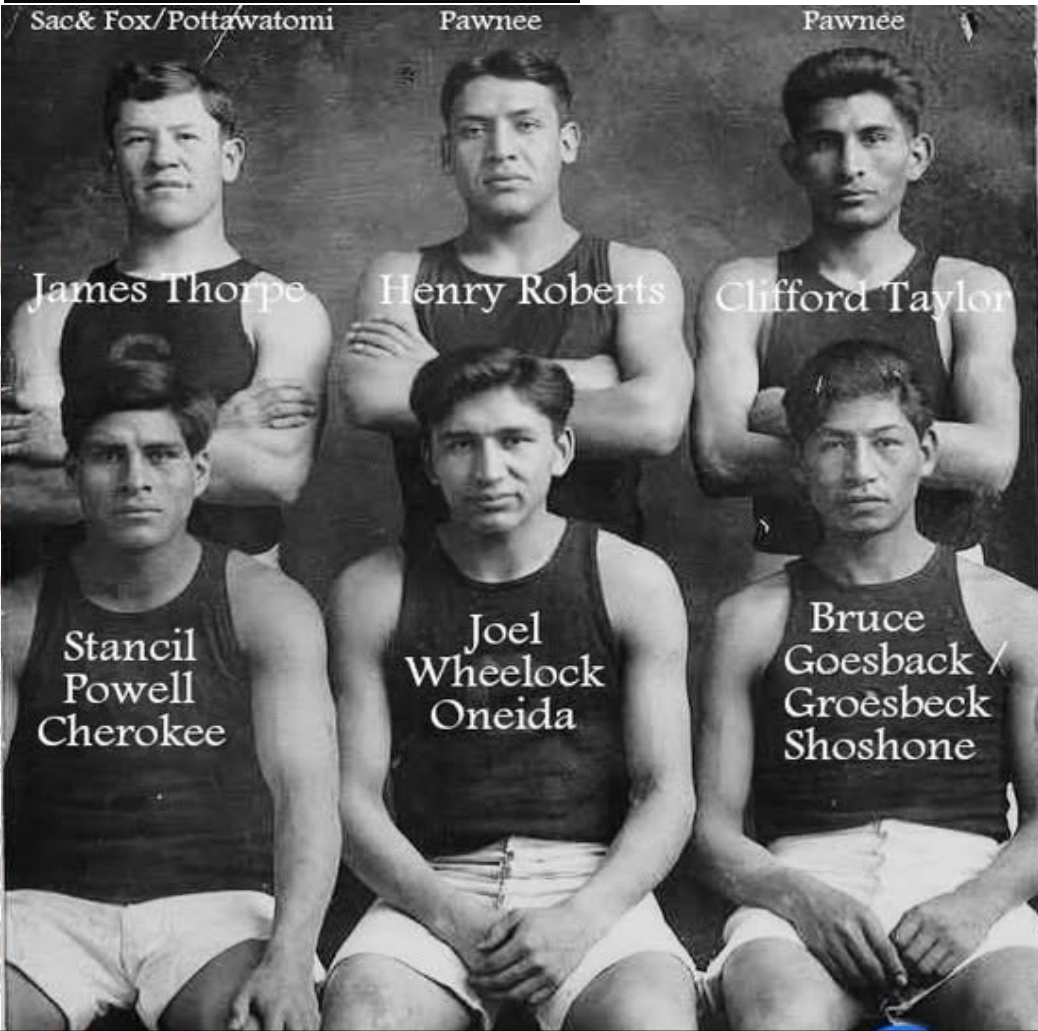

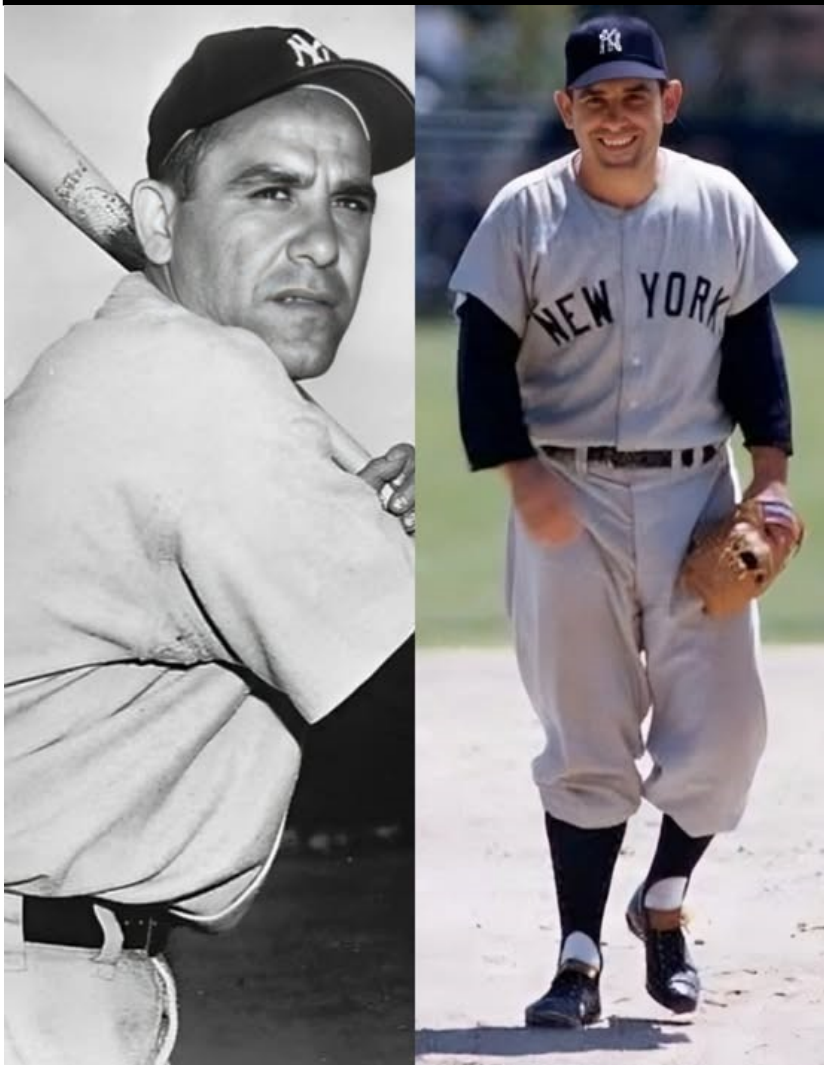

## Yogi Berra NY Yankees

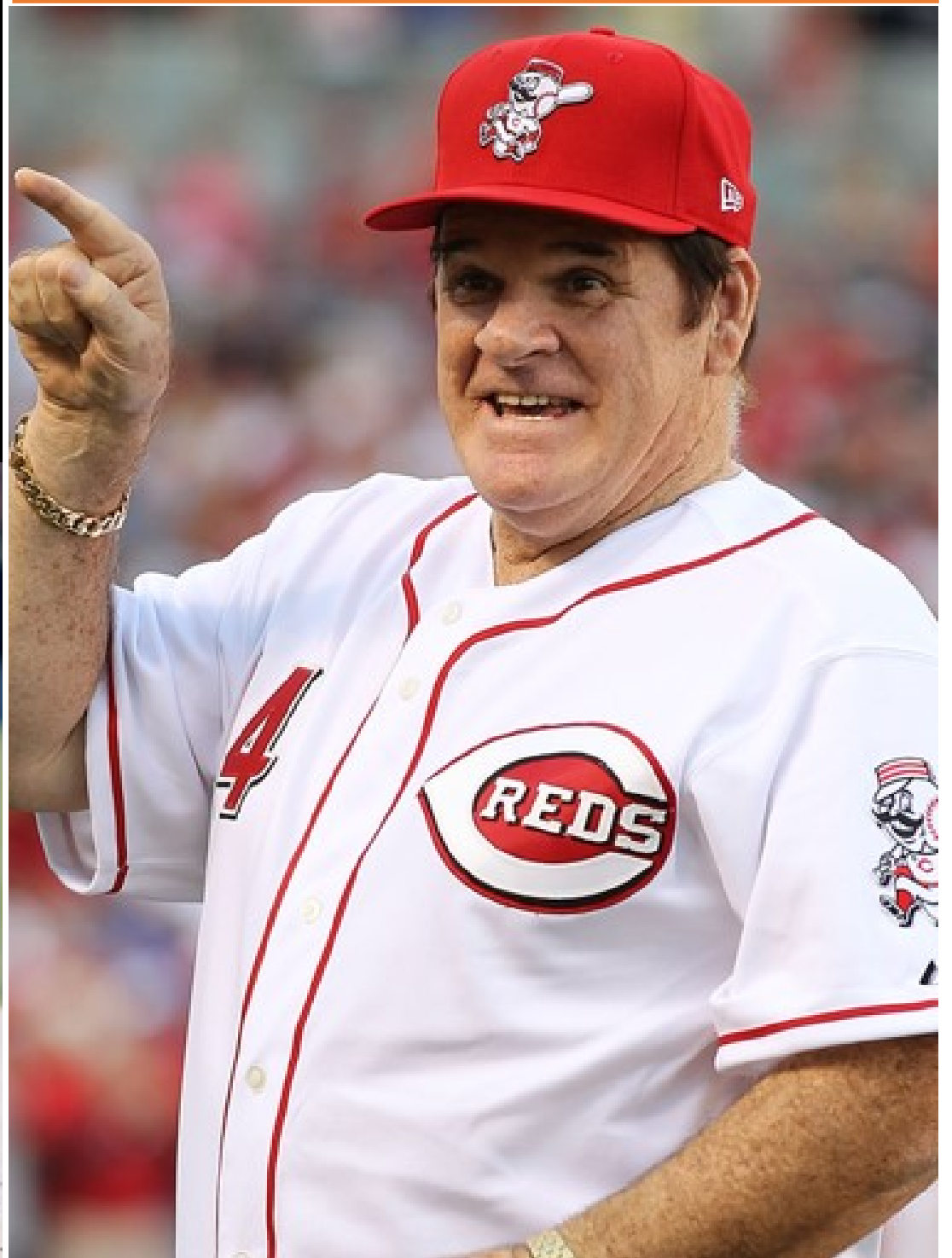

Assembly education committee approves Ramos bill to strengthen Native American student rights to wear tribal regalia at graduation ceremonies

**SACRAMENTO**—Schools would be prohibited from creating any process that would discourage or prevent Native American students from displaying any tribal adornment or ceremonial regalia at graduation ceremonies under a bill approved unanimously today by the Assembly Education Committee. Assemblymember James C. Ramos (D-San Bernardino) introduced the bill, AB 1369.

*“Despite existing legislation and constitutional protections to allow students to wear traditional tribal regalia at graduation ceremonies, Native American youth and their families continue to face obstacles and challenges. Graduation ceremonies are a time for young people, their families and tribal communities to share pride and joy in a major accomplishment. AB 1369 adds clarity to current law so that students’ and families’ celebration is not marred by unnecessary turmoil,”* Ramos said. He noted that regalia might include items such as eagle feathers or beading and represent cultural and religious

In 2018, the Legislature took action to protect student rights by passing AB 1248 (Chapter 804, Statutes of 2018). That bill stated, *“A pupil may wear traditional tribal regalia or recognized objects of religious or cultural significance as an adornment at school graduation ceremonies.”* Despite this language, school districts continue to tell Native American students they cannot wear tribal regalia.

In 2021, the legislature passed Ramos’s AB 945 (Chapter 285, Statutes of 2021) which established a task force that would provide education leaders with policy, procedure, and best practices recommendations for the implementation of AB 1284.

California Indian Legal Services and the Tule River Indian Tribe are the AB 1369 sponsors, and it is also supported by the Fresno Unified School District, ACLU California Action, Habematoel Pomo of Upper Lake and Indigenous Justice.

AB 1369 will next go to the Assembly Judiciary Committee.
