



Texas Rep. Jasmine Crockett's (D) concerted effort for newsworthy soundbites continued to prove a double-edged sword for the Dallas-area lawmaker. Facing scrutiny over expressing her hope to see Elon Musk "taken down" and for refusing to apologize after referring to Texas Gov. Greg Abbott (R) as "Governor Hot Wheels," a new viral clip found her taking umbrage with Florida Rep. Byron Donalds' (R) interracial marriage.

Appearing on "The Breakfast Club" in June 2024 while wearing a t-shirt that referenced a dig at Georgia Rep. Marjorie Taylor Greene (R) and her "bleached blonde, bad-built, butch body," Crockett turned her attention to Donalds and his wife of more than 20 years, Erika Donalds.

Gingrich: 'Who made the decisions as though they were president?'



Former House Speaker Newt Gingrich appeared on Fox News Thursday and called for the creation of either a joint House-Senate committee or a special commission to investigate whether Joe Biden was mentally incapacitated during his term as president and also whether White House staff concealed it.

In Chris Whipple's new book, former top aide Ron Klain <u>revealed</u> that during debate preparations Biden often struggled and would fall asleep. During an appearance on "Jesse Watters Primetime," Gingrich said that the investigation should not only uncover the truth about Biden's mental fitness but also determine the constitutional implications when people who aren't president make decisions on the president's behalf.

"I think both the House and the Senate should empanel special committees to just focus on this issue. Who was the president? Who lied about the president? Who made the decisions as though they were president? And what is the constitutional implication of having people who are not the president making these kinds of decisions? I think this is a very serious, profound historic moment, not a political moment. It ought to be a truly bipartisan committee, truly bipartisan effort," Gingrich said. "Either there has to be a joint House and Senate committee, or there has to be a special commission. I have to say, in all the years I've studied, both as a history teacher and as an elected official, the idea that these people knew — it's pretty clear now that a lot of them knew that he was gone," Gingrich told Watters.

"Because all of us ought to have an interest as Americans in knowing what happened and how could we have been lied to for at least a minimum of two or two and a half years."

OPEC+ is boosting output in April. Here's what that could mean for oil prices.




Tighter U.S. sanctions on Iran and Russia, threats of sanctions on buyers of Venezuelan oil and concerns over a possible tariff-related recession have all provided support to oil, setting up prices to end the month very close to where they started.

And a lot has happened in the few weeks since OPEC+ confirmed they would start to lift production with the U.S., reportedly indicating that it plans to refill its oil reserve to full capacity, shifting tariff-policy plans from the Trump administration and flareups in the Middle East.

Given all of that, Tompkins said Capital Economics expects any near-term rise in oil prices from U.S. pressure on Venezuela and Iran to "dissipate," and is sticking with its forecast for **Brent crude** to end 2025 at \$70 a barrel.

Assembly education committee approves Ramos bill to strengthen Native American student rights to wear tribal regalia at graduation ceremonies

SACRAMENTO—Schools would be prohibited from creating any process that would discourage or prevent Native American students from displaying any tribal adornment or ceremonial regalia at graduation ceremonies under a bill approved unanimously today by the Assembly Education Committee. Assemblymember James C. Ramos (D-San Bernardino) introduced the bill, AB 1369.

"Despite existing legislation and constitutional protections to allow students to wear traditional tribal regalia at graduation ceremonies, Native American youth and their families continue to face obstacles and challenges. Graduation ceremonies are a time for young people, their families and tribal communities to share pride and joy in a major accomplishment. AB 1369 adds clarity to current law so that students' and families' celebration is not marred by unnecessary turmoil," Ramos said. He noted that regalia might include items such as eagle feathers or beading and represent cultural and religious

In 2018, the Legislature took action to protect student rights by passing AB 1248 (Chapter 804, Statutes of 2018). That bill stated, "A pupil may wear traditional tribal regalia or recognized objects of religious of cultural significance as an adornment at school graduation ceremonies." Despite this language, school districts continue to tell Native American students they cannot wear tribal regalia.

In 2021, the legislature passed Ramos's AB 945 (Chapter 285, Statutes of 2021) which established a task force that would provide education leaders with policy, procedure, and best practices recommendations for the implementation of AB 1284.

California Indian Legal Services and the Tule River Indian Tribe are the AB 1369 sponsors, and it is also supported by the Fresno Unified School District, ACLU California Action, Habematolel Pomo of Upper Lake and Indigenous Justice.

AB 1369 will next go to the Assembly Judiciary Committee.


