



ESPN's Stephen A Smith torches Democrats after DOJ IG revelation on Jan 6 FBI informants



Justice Department Inspector General Michael Horowitz said there were a total of 26 confidential human sources in the crowd outside the Capitol on Jan. 6, 2021 but only three were assigned by the FBI to be present for the event, while stressing that none of the sources were authorized or directed by the bureau to "break the law" or "encourage others to commit illegal acts."

Smith recalled the report on <u>"The</u> Stephen A. Smith Show" and became irate about Democrats misrepresenting information.

Prices rose over 20% under Joe Biden's administration



(The Center Square) - President Joe Biden is only a few weeks away from the end of his time in office, and one key part of his legacy is undeniable: inflation.

Biden has battled inflation from the start, but critics say he helped fuel it with trillions of dollars in deficit spending during his four years in office. Federal debt spending is offset in part by printing money, which increases inflation.

"The Biden-Harris Administration's parting gift to the American people is as welcome as a lump of coal at Christmas: higher prices that keep rising," House Ways and Means Committee Chairman Jason Smith, R-Mo., said in a statement Friday. "Families have been hammered by a 20 percent spike in prices under President Biden that has made the cost of living unaffordable. The American people are ready for the Trump presidency and a return to a strong, prosperous economy that created good-paying jobs."

Polling data showed that despite some positive economic indicators this year relatively low unemployment among them — Americans still had a poor view of the economy. At least one reason why was undeniably that costs, for groceries in particular, have soared since Biden took office.

Polling after the November election showed voters cited higher prices as a key consideration in their vote.

California land to be returned to Yurok Tribe

Rosie Clayburn is a descendant of the Yurok Tribe, which had its territory - called 'O Rew in the Yurok language - ripped from them nearly two centuries ago.

"As the natural world became completely decimated, so did the Yurok people," she said.

That decimation started when miners rushed in for gold, killing and displacing tens of thousands of Native Americans in California and ravaging the redwood trees for lumber.

"Everything was extracted that was marketable," Clayburn said. "We've always had this really intricate relationship with the landscape. We've hunted, we've fished, we've gathered. And those are all management tools. Everything that we do has been in balance with the natural world."


Now, generations later, 125 acres bordering Redwood National and State Parks will be handed back to the Yuroks.

The nonprofit Save the Redwoods League purchased the land in 2013 from an old timber mill, with the original goal of giving it to the National Park Service.

"As we continued conversations about the transfer of this land to the National Park Service, we began to realize that perhaps a better alternative would be to transfer the land back to the Yurok Tribe," said Save the Redwoods League's Paul Ringgold. "No one knows this land better. They've been stewarding this land since time and memorial"

A Native American tribe is closer to acquiring more land in Arizona after decades of delay

Federal officials have joined with the A long time coming state of Arizona to begin fulfilling a settlement agreement that was reached with the Hopi Tribe nearly three decdescribed as a historic day.

Government attorneys filed condemnation documents on Friday to transfer dozens of square miles of state land into trust for the Hopi. The tribe will compensate the state nearly \$4 million for more than 31 square miles (80 square kilometers) of land near Wins-

It could mark the first of more transfers of land into trust to help eliminate the checkerboard of ownership that characterizes much of the lands used by the tribe for ranching in northeastern Arizona.

Friday's filing was born out of the 1996 passage of the Navajo-Hopi Land Disades ago, marking what tribal officials pute Settlement Act, which ratified an agreement between the Hopi and federal government that set conditions for taking land into trust for the tribe.

The wrangling over land in northeastern Arizona has been bitter, pitting the Hopi and the Navajo Nation against one another for generations. The federal government failed in its attempt to have the tribes share land and after years of escalating conflict, Congress in 1974 divided the area and ordered tribal members to leave each other's reser-

December 29, 2024 marks the 134th anniversary of the Wounded Knee Massacre on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, South Dakota in 1890.

Time should not diminish its memory, as it was only one of numerous acts of terrorism and genocide committed against our people.

Just as we celebrate Christmas in honor of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ (At least for many of us believers and not so politically correct folks) and with the New Year right around the corner let us take a moment to remember and honor our people murdered at Wounded Knee, South Dakota.

On that infamous day, December 29, 1890 it is estimated that 275 Lakota Sioux men, women and children were murdered with hundreds more wounded and 25 U.S. soldiers killed and for no other reason than fear! **Fear of the "Ghost Dance"** was the reason given as if one could justify the incomprehensible murdering and maining of so many innocent people. Why, because of the political policies at that period in time.

After all what more could the "Indians" want? The Government was going to take care of them as long as the rivers flow and the grass shall grow!!!!!

Again, two months short of 52-years on February 27, 1973, Wounded Knee, South Dakota became the center of national attention when American Indian Movement (AIM) leaders, Dennis Banks and Russel Means led an armed takeover and occupation of Wounded Knee.

The protest followed the failure of an effort of the Oglala Sioux Civil Rights Organization (OSCRO) to impeach tribal president Richard Wilson, whom they accused of corruption.

The armed occupancy of Wounded Knee which received national attention, ended after 71 days when Lawrence "Buddy" Lamont, a local Oglala Lakota, was killed by a shot from a government sniper on April 26, 1973. He was buried on the site in a Sioux ceremony. A U.S. marshal was also shot and paralyzed.

After Lamont's death, tribal elders called an end to the occupation. Knowing the young man and his mother from the reservation, many Oglala were greatly sorrowed by his death. Both sides reached an agreement on May 5, 1973 to disarm.

Over 200 federal armed law enforcement were joined by local law enforcement and Wilson's private militia, Guardians of the Oglala Nation (GOONs).

With the decision made to end the protest, many Oglala Lakota began to leave Wounded Knee under the cover of darkness walking out through the federal agents lines.

Three days later, the siege ended and the town was evacuated after 71 days of occupation; Government agents took control of the town.

Many American Indian supporters traveled to Wounded Knee to join the protest. At the time there was widespread public sympathy for the goals of the occupation, as Americans were becoming more aware of longstanding issues of injustice related to American Indians.

AIM leaders Dennis Banks and Russell Means were indicted on charges related to the events, but their case was dismissed by the federal court for prosecutorial misconduct, and upheld on appeal.

With the support of the U.S. Government, Wilson stayed in office and in 1974 was re-elected amid charges of intimidation, voter fraud, and other abus-

The rate of violence climbed on the reservation as conflict opened between the political factions during the following three years; *More than 60 opponents* of Wilson's tribal government died violently during those years, including Pedro Bissonette, director of the Oglala Sioux Civil Rights Organization. Traditional tribal members blamed Wilson's private militia, Guardians of the Oglala Nation (GOONs).


Shortly following the Wounded Knee standoff 21year old Leonard Peltier, a young AIM leader was asked by traditional Indian people at Pine Ridge, to help protect them from being targeted for violence by Wilson's tribal GOONs. He went to their aid never to return home to his wife and children.

On June 26, 1975 two FBI agents in unmarked cars followed a pick-up truck onto the Jumping Bull ranch. The families immediately became alarmed and feared an attack. Shots were fired and a shootout ensued. More than 150 federal agents. GOONS, and law enforcement officers surrounded the ranch occupied by 40 traditional Indians.

When the shoot-out ended FBI Special Agents, Jack R. Coler and Ronald A. Williams and American Indian, Joseph Stuntz lay dead. Stuntz's death has never been investigated, nor has anyone ever been charged in connection with his death.

Leonard Peltier was convicted for the deaths of the two FBI agents killed during the shoot-out on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation.

He was sentenced to life in prison where he remains as many Tribal and non-tribal people believe as a political prisoner to this day.



Yet, 60 Oglala Sioux died at the hands of the GOONS after that infamous day and no one was ever investigated, charged or prosecuted. The FBI and GOONS prevailed.

Numerous doubts have been raised over Peltier's guilt and the fairness of his trial, based on allegations and inconsistencies regarding the FBI and prosecution's handling of this case.

Even former U.S. Attorney General, Ramsey Clark served pro bono as one of Peltier's lawyers and has aided in filing a series of appeals on Peltier's behalf. In all appeals, the conviction and sentence have been affirmed by the 8th Circuit Court of Appeals.

The sad irony is that 134-years after the December 29, 1890 Wounded Knee Massacre and almost 52years since the 1973 armed protect on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, South Dakota very little has changed for the American Indians.

However, progress is being made as more tribes are getting involved in the political process but government dependency is hard nut to break.

Gilbert Isaac, CADC-II, Counselor and Group Facilitator, leads the Tribal Recovery Track, bringing a personal passion for the program as a Native American and extensive qualifications, including Generation Red Road Curriculum training and 15 years experience in substance use disorder treatment.

"When we started introducing the Red Road curriculum, the patient feedback among our Native American patients revealed that this new approach was not only needed, but that it played an important role in their recovery by honoring their distinct cultural experiences and perspectives. It crafts a recovery path that ensures a holistic and culturally sensitive approach to healing," said Gilbert.

Getty Images Fulton County District Attorney Fani Willis must comply with a subpoena for testimony and documents related to allegations of misconduct in her handling of the 2020 election interference case against President-elect Donald Trump, a Georgia judge ruled this week.

The Georgia state Senate Special Committee issued Willis the subpoena earlier this year as part of an investigation into the 53-year-old prosecutor's alleged misuse of taxpayer money and potential conflicts of interest during her

romance with former Trump special prosecutor Nathan Wade.

Willis - who was disqualified from the Trump case last week by Georgia Court of Appeals flouted the panel's subpoena in September, arguing that the committee did not have the authority to compel her to testify or turn over documents.

Fulton County Superior Court Judge Shukura Ingram ruled Monday that Willis has until Jan. 13 to file a list of claimed privileges and objections to any subpoena requests from the special committee.

Willis plans to appeal the ruling.




"We believe the ruling is wrong and will appeal," former Democratic Georgia Gov. Roy Barnes, who is representing Willis in the case, told the Associated Press.






